C-STEAM Powers St. Norbert School!

STEM is an educational approach focused on the foundations of science, technology, engineering, and math, with curriculum and activities encouraging young minds to explore in unique, hands-on ways. At St. Norbert School, we also incorporate the arts and the teachings of our Catholic faith. As a result, every day our students are powered by our faith through C-STEAM (Catholic - Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math)!

In our PreK classroom, Mrs. Donaher proves that it's never too early to start putting C-STEAM in action. Through fun, interactive activities, the children engage

in what looks like "play" but is actually a carefully constructed environment where they are encouraged to ask questions, hypothesize, discuss their observations, and come up with conclusions. "I make it a point not to interrupt this thought process because watching them make their own discoveries is a sacred experience," said Mrs. Donaher. "It's how I perceive God at work in the human mind." Activities include a Halloween challenge to build a haunted house with a baby ghost (tissue with eyes), creating the letters of the alphabet using strips of paper, and making patterns with pom-poms and tweezers.

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Earlier this year, second graders completed a STEM Lego challenge-to design a new mailbox for Santa because his old one was overflowing! Working in small groups, the students first discussed a plan for creating an elevated mailbox with a bag of Legos and an envelope for measurement. Through this project, they worked on the skills of collaboration, problem solving, planning, measuring, and building.

"C-STEAM to me is real-world application of knowledge and skills, and I use it to develop projects that cross all curriculums and focus from the past all the way through to the modern society," says upper school social studies teacher Mrs. Klunk. She believes that connecting C-STEAM and social studies shows

the students that events are not isolated. For example, technological advances such as the cotton gin and the electric light bulb both had societal implications. Her students come to understand the integration between science and technology and world events.

In Mr. DeSimone's Technology Instruction classes, eighth graders create a memory box, a process that incorporates all elements of C-STEAM, from programming the circuit board computer and learning about light and illumination, to measurement, construction, and artistic decoration. Sixth graders get to build and program a LEGO EV3 Robot, requiring students to apply various concepts such as light and distance, computer programming, and mathematic wheel calculations.

All grades have fun learning and exploring through C-STEAM at St. Norbert School!

It was an action-packed Fall for St. Norbert CYO field hockey, soccer, and cross country teams.

Field Hockey

The St. Norbert's/St. Patrick's Varsity field hockey team clinched the Archdiocesan Field Hockey Championship, defeating St. Joseph's 2-1 in sudden death double overtime. Earlier this Fall, the Varsity team won the Acorn Tournament, an annual event that raises money for charity.

The players took some time off the field to participate in a special service project, working with Mrs. Lori Myers to prepare lasagna formaggio in the SNS kitchen. The team made five large pans of lasagna to donate to a local family and area shelters.



Soccer

The JV soccer team, seeded #4 heading into the playoffs, beat #1 seed St. Aloysius 4-3 in the semifinals, and then defeated Saints Simon and Jude 2-1 to win the Region 17 CYO Championship.

The Varsity team finished the regular season strong with a record of 6-1-2, and advanced to the playoff quarter finals.

Cross Country

This fall the St. Norbert Cross Country team's overall average mile split improved from 9:52/mile to 8:36/mile



over the course of eight races. Several runners achieved below 7:30/mile on the demanding, historic Belmont Plateau cross country course in Fairmount Park.

Team members also participated in the Regional Cross Country Championship in Bucks County and the National Cross Country Championship in Nashville, TN.

Service to those in need in our community is at the forefront of all we do at St. Norbert School. Initiatives, such as the peanut butter and jelly drive, the Nickel Race, and the St. Jude's Math-a-Thon bring the entire school together for an important cause. The students work on special service projects as well in their individual classrooms each year.

Mrs. Dunkerley's kindergarteners make stuffed animals that are then delivered to children at Nemours/DuPont Hospital for Children. The students take pride in stuffing their animal and adding a heart and special wish for the recipient. They also complete a birth certificate for their creation and decorate a gift bag. "Children at this age

can relate to cuddling with a stuffed animal for comfort and doing something special for sick children," says Mrs. Dunkerley.

In sixth grade, Mrs. Klunk's students put together chemo bags that are delivered to Chester County and Paoli oncology offices.
